



## Governor Tim Walz Extends Stay At Home Order & Updates Minnesota April 30, 2020

**Executive Order 20-48** allows workers in non-customer facing industrial and office settings to return to work. It further allows customer-facing retail businesses that sell goods to engage in curbside or outside pick-up and delivery.

**All workers who can work from home must continue to do so.** There are also a number of other conditions laid out EO 20-48, including creating a COVID-19 Preparedness Plan and not permitting customers to enter a business premises.

- Governor Walz extended the stay at home for bars, restaurants and public accommodations (including salons, barbershops) until May 18, 2020
- All customer-facing retail businesses establishments are set to reopen operations for curbside pick-ups and delivery beginning May 4, 2020
- Every business must develop and post a plan for how to do so
- Online payment should be used in every possible scenario
- Employees and customers should wear masks and protective equipment
- Encourages all Minnesotans to wear masks when outside the home
- In curbside or outside pick-up scenarios, social distancing guidelines apply. Don't leave your vehicle if possible.
- In delivery scenarios, items should be deposited outside a customer's residence.
